84/05 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Footpaths

The Chairman and Cllr Bourne have spoken with the Probation Service with a view to them carrying out some work on the footpaths around the village, as the Minor Maintenance Agreement money from DCC needs to be spent by the end of the year, as yet the PC have expended around £171 and there is a shortfall of just over £200. The probation service will provide labour but the Parish Council will meet material costs.

RESOLVED:

To use the remainder of the money to pay for materials and tools for clearing to paths within the village.

Cemetery

The retaining wall fell down on Christmas Eve, Derbyshire Dales were contacted and made good the damage very quickly in the interests of health and safety.

There is work to be carried out to the cemetery path, this will be in the region of £3000, costs can be borne as follows: Cllr Flitter has allocated £540, £500 from another benefactor, £200 from Ernest Bailey Charity, the remainder from the Parish Council.

RESOLVED:

Cllr Taylor would start to build up a specification for the work for the contractors to be able to tender on.

Fees and Charge also need to be reviewed for next financial year.

85/05 FETE FIELD PROGRESS

Again, no progress to report, although the Chairman has asked the architect to get in touch with the proposed contractor to extend the availability period.

The Chair is currently trying to obtain a quote for a ramp up to the existing building.

A discussion took place with regard to 'heavy' vehicles using Spout Lane as the road surface is in a poor condition and also the possible detrimental effect on the drainage system.
